

Getting to know your loom:

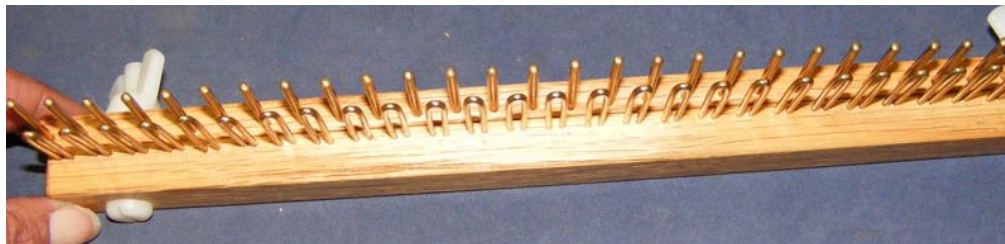
Look at the 2 pieces, and you will see one board has pegs, the ones with the inverted u shape; the other board has pins, or rods.

The pins and pegs are not on the center of the boards.



By assembling the boards facing a different way we will obtain 3 basic gauges.

If we assemble it, with the 2 sides with the smallest edges facing each other, we obtain gauge 1. This gauge works great with light weight yarns.



By assembling one small edge, facing one big edge we obtain the second setting. Gauge 2 works good with medium weight yarn, like Red Heart medium.



By assembling the 2 boards with the biggest edges facing each other we get gauge 3. This gauge is the one for bulky yarns, or 2 strand of worsted yarn, held together.



Adding washers between the 2 boards, on any one of the settings, will give another gauge.



So, get your yarn, play around and find the gauge that suits your needs.
