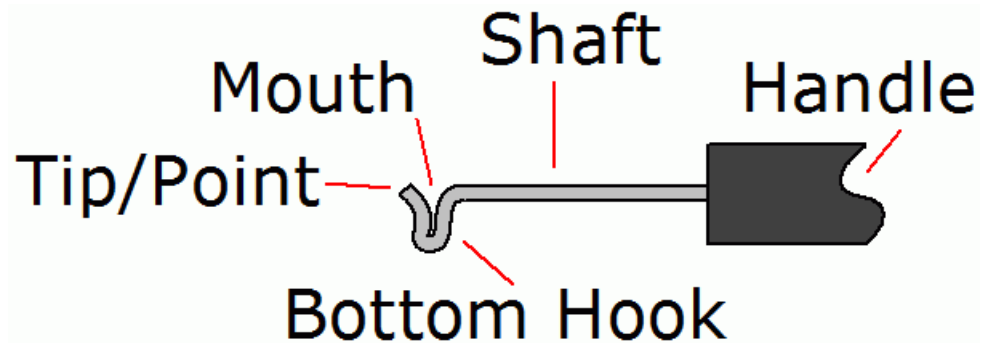


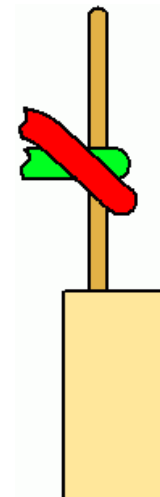
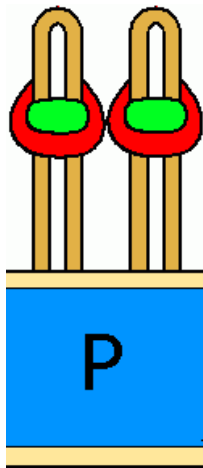


Using The Purl Tool

Here you see the names of the parts of the Purl Tool by what I will be calling them in this document. At this time Cliff has a white purl tool that you receive when you order your loom(s) he also has a large handle wood tool with changeable Purl Tool/Hook. The handle is only colored in these diagrams for ease of seeing it. Also you will note it is a very short handle shown in the diagrams the squiggle at the end shows they are really longer than what is pictured. The same is true for the yarns.



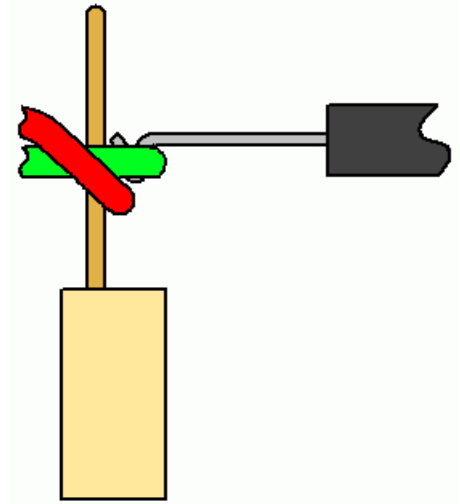
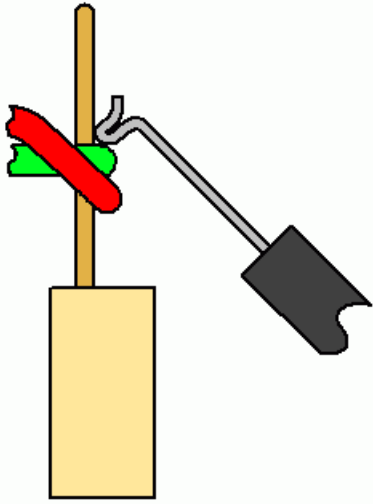
On the left you see how 2 pegs might look continuously wrapped on a KISS Loom. On the right you see what those stitches would look like from the side view. For the purposes of these instructions we will be working with the side view of the loom *without* showing the pins. Note this process of using the Purl Tool works on all looms not just KISS Looms. It does not matter if you are using the looms if in the round, rake or double rake, the Purl Tool works the same with all.



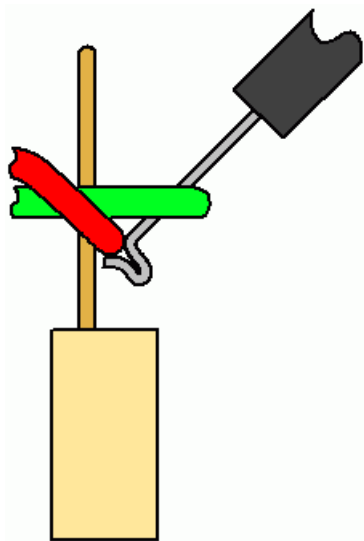


Using The Purl Tool

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Take the bottom hook of the Purl Tool behind the stitch (shown in green) on the loom.



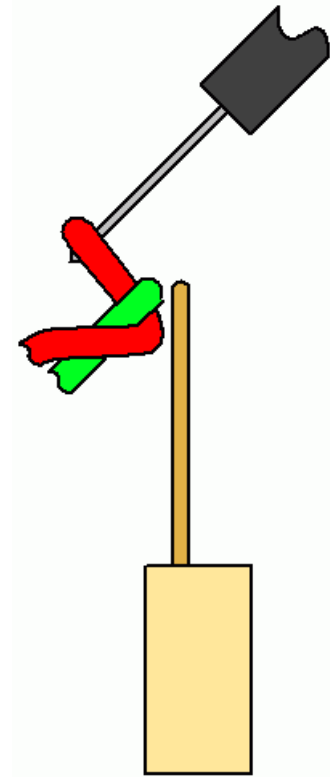
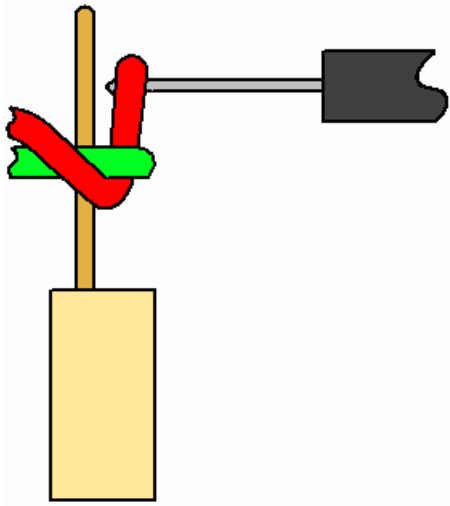
Pull out on the stitch only far enough to allow the Purl Tool to slide the stitch up along the shaft and the mouth of the Purl Tool to grab a hold of the working yarn (shown in red).



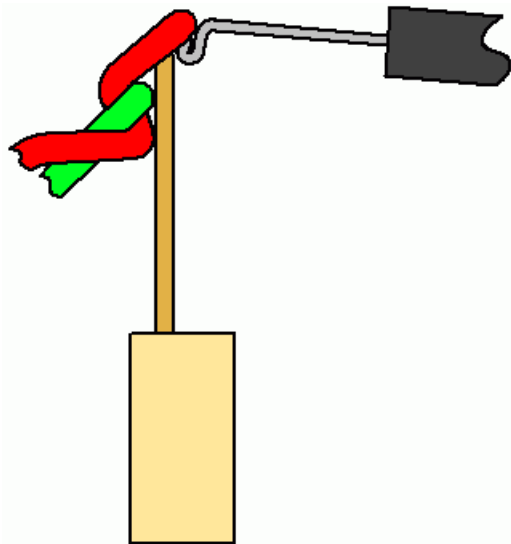


Using The Purl Tool

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With the working yarn (shown in red) held in the mouth of the Purl Tool lift up on the Purl Tool lifting the working yarn (purl stitch) completely off the peg.



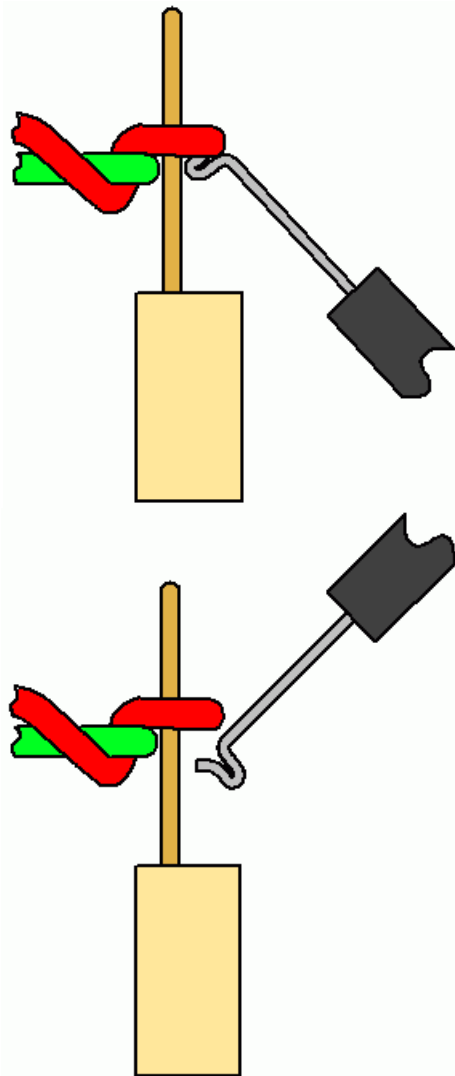
With the purl stitch still held in the mouth of the Purl Tool slide the purl stitch back onto the peg.

Continue to slide the purl stitch down onto the peg using the mouth of the Purl Tool.

Unhook the purl stitch from the mouth of the Purl Tool, proceed to you next stitch.

In using the Purl Tool in this way you never have to use your fingers to hold onto the purl stitch and put it back on the loom. Everything is done with the Purl Tool.
